What ANEPF is:

- Created the 24th of May 1968.
- 24 faculties of pharmacy all around France.
- Official address in Paris, at the National Pharmacist Board Office.
- Non political and non syndicate association
- Full member of IPSF and EPSA

Who we are:

- The executive: 13 members this year
- President, Treasurer and Secretary General
- 7 Vice presidents (formation, education, international, sponsorship...)
- 2 Project managers (not every year)
- 1 Editor.
- Elected every October at the Annual Congress



Introduction

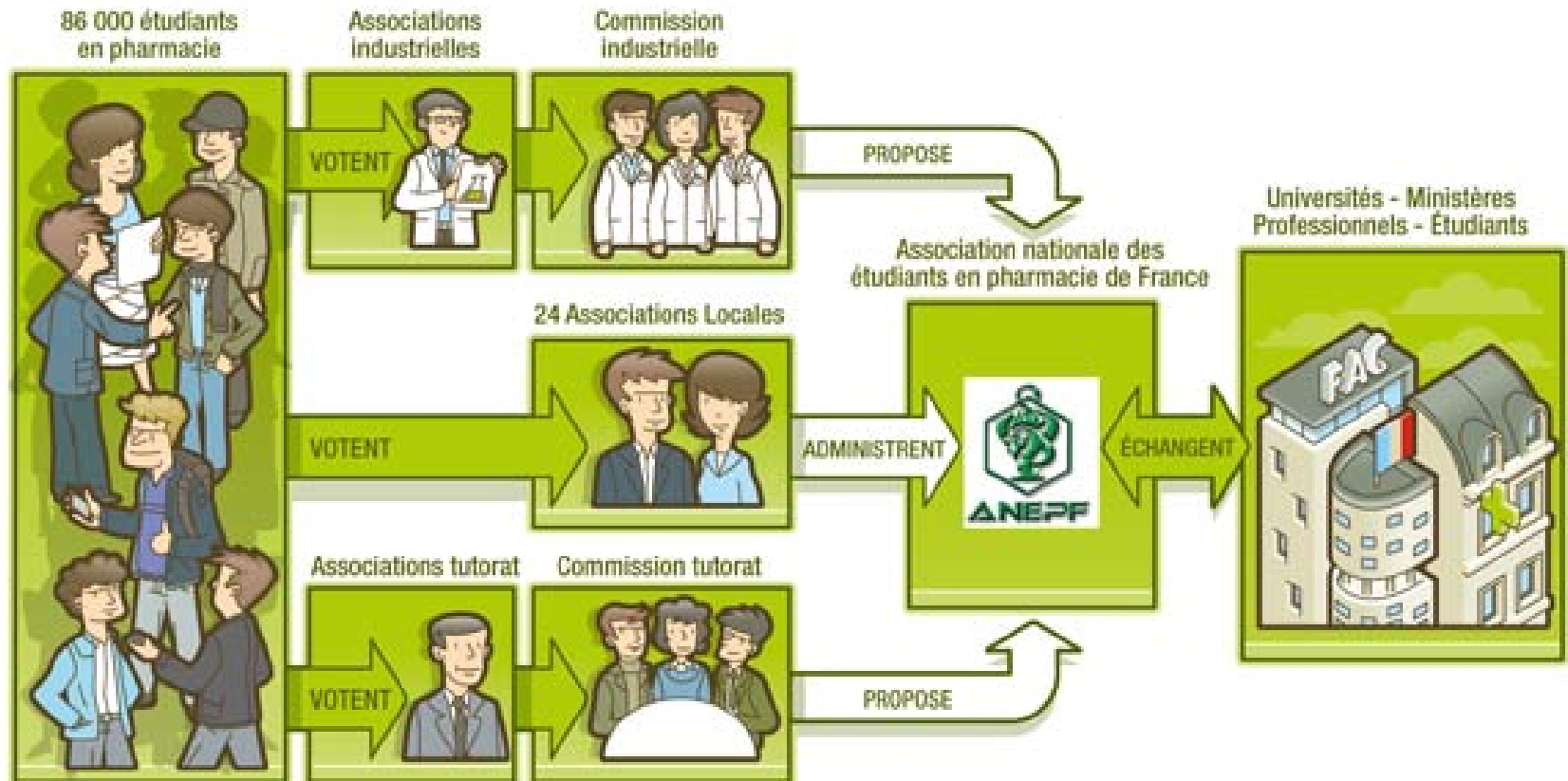
What we do:

- Represent the 33 000 French pharmacy students
- Promote link between them
- Close relations with the Government, the deans, the commissions that rule pharmacy studies, the syndicates, the local associations...
- 5 General Assemblies and an Annual Congress every year (between 200 and 350 students)

1st year of studies

Origines:

- Improve and put in the same shape all the health studies.
- Create a common culture between health professionals.
- Avoid “human waste”



1st year of studies

Former model:

- Group 1: Pharmacy students on one side
- Group 2: Medical, dental, physiotherapy students and midwives on other one.
- For both: entrance exam in the end of the first year.
- For group 2, choice in functions of the rank.



1st year of studies

New model:

- One group with all specialties.
- Common lectures during 4 months
- Common lectures and specific classes for each specialty the next 4 months.
- You can choose to present as much exams as you want. But you have to go to each classes !
- Choices in functions of the rank also.



1st year of studies

Conséquences

- Number of students
 - Lectures
 - Workshops
- Quality of studies
 - Screen, no professor
 - Noise, space...
 - Amount of work



1st year of studies

Conséquences

- Year of selection and no more year of formation
 - Cumulated programs of former model
 - Fall of the 2nd year students' level
- Increase of failing students and re-orientation not well organized
- Number of students in pharmacy decreasing



1st year of studies

Conséquences

- First results:
 - Pharmacy: last choice of students
 - Average mark between 6 and 9 over 20 in some faculties
 - Numerus Clausus not even complete in some faculties.
 - Pharmacist become a “sub-physician”
- Letters sent to Minister
- Wish to withdraw from this reform
