



Vampire Cup Campaign Competition Criteria

1. WHAT IS THE VAMPIRE CUP (VC) COMPETITION?

The VC competition is an international blood drive encouraging IPSF member associations to raise awareness about the importance of blood donation. Please refer to Vampire Cup campaign kits for further information.

2. WHO MAY ENTER THE COMPETITION?

All pharmacy students within IPSF member associations are entitled to enter the competition. In addition, non-pharmacy students may donate blood on behalf of that association to contribute to the blood drive to reflect the increased awareness of the importance of blood donation to members of the public.

Entrance to the competition should be organised by the IPSF Contact Person (CP)/presidents who must coordinate with a national/international organization responsible for blood donation (i.e. Red Cross or equivalent organizations) to organise the national blood drives. The CPs/presidents must communicate their intention to participate with the IPSF Chairperson of Public health (publichealth@ipsf.org) AND the IPSF humanitarian coordinator (humanitarian@ipsf.org).

Entrants should match criteria set out by the national/international organization responsible for blood donation (i.e. Red Cross or equivalent organisations) regarding blood donation.

3. WHAT IS THE COMPETITION TIMELINE?

CPs must contact the IPSF Humanitarian Coordinator and the Chairperson of Public Health by the 6th of May to inform them of their participation in the project with the registration information listed at the end of this document.

All blood drives must have a 6 week activity period in order to ensure that it meets the criteria for entering the competition. Should the blood donation drive extend beyond the 6 weeks duration, only the first 6 weeks of blood donation drive will be accounted. The 6 week campaign period must be between Jan 1st, 2011 to June 20th, 2011.

Associations may choose to encourage blood donation over the whole 6 week period or may have a specific time and date set up for this. These details are to be decided by the association as part of their planning to obtain the most blood donations.

All VC campaigns must be completed at least 6 weeks prior to the start of the annual IPSF congress. (June 20th, 2011) Post campaign reports must be submitted to the IPSF Humanitarian Coordinator and the Chairperson of Public Health prior to this same date (Please see end of this document for post campaign related details).

4. WHAT ARE THE PRIZES?

The winning association will be awarded the **Vampire Cup** at IPSF Annual Congress.

All participating associations will receive an official IPSF VC participation certificate.

5. JUDGING CRITERIA

CPs must coordinate with a national/international organization responsible for blood donation (i.e. Red Cross or equivalent organisation) to record the amount of blood donated (in units) and the number of people who have donated blood on behalf of that association. This document should be sent to the IPSF humanitarian coordinator and the Chairperson of Public Health. The document must be stamped by the organisation or signed by the president of the organization to prove its authenticity.

To account for the number of members in different organisations the following calculation will be completed:

$$\frac{\text{Units of blood donated}}{\text{Number of members registered within IPSF member association}}$$

6. The CPs/president of the association has the responsibility of completing the activity report, which may be presented at the Annual Congress when presenting the prize to the winning organisation.

VC Criteria Checklist:

- Inform IPSF of project participation by May 6th, 2011
 - Completion of the registration form and email to humanitarian@ipsf.org and publichealth@ipsf.org
- Applying association must be a registered IPSF member
- 6 week campaign period
 - Campaign period must be between January 1st, 2011 to June 20th, 2011
 - Should the blood donation drive extend beyond the 6 weeks duration, only the first 6 weeks of blood donation drive will be accounted
- Participants should meet blood donation criteria (ex. Correct weight, age, etc.) of the national/international organization responsible for blood donation (i.e. Red Cross or equivalent organisation)
- Completion of a Post-VC campaign report to be submitted by June 20th, 2011
