



About Iran

Iran, a country with a history of over 3,000 years and home to one of the oldest known civilizations, is the 18th largest country in the world and the 17th most populated nation. Tehran is the capital and largest city of Iran. It is located in the northern part of the country below Alborz Mountains. Other large metropolitan areas include, but are not limited to, Mashhad, Isfahan, Tabriz, Shiraz, Ahwaz, Yazd and Hamadan.

The official language of Iran is Persian and the most practiced religion is Islam. Islamic social rules are therefore observed by the entire population. Nonetheless, due to various backgrounds and roots of all communities and civilizations which, in a period throughout human history, have settled in Iran, different religions, lifestyles and languages are present and actively used and practiced in this country.

Climatic and weather conditions in the country are diverse due to the vast land area that Iran covers. It is common to refer to Iran as a country of four seasons.


Culture

Iran's carpet-weaving has its origins in the Bronze Age, and is one of the most distinguished manifestations of Iranian art. Iran is the world's largest producer and exporter of handmade carpets, producing three quarters of the world's total output and having a share of 30% of world's export markets.




Cuisine

Iranian food is some of the most delicious and fresh in its region. Due to Iran's variety of ethnic groups and the influences from the neighboring cultures, the cuisine of Iran is very diverse. Rice and bread are the staple foods of the Iranians.

There are many spices used in Iranian cuisine to flavor food. One of the traditional and most widespread Iranian spices is saffron. Tea is also widely consumed by Iranians. It is usually brewed with cardamom, cinnamon or rose petals, and served with rock candy or sugar cubes. Iran is the world's seventh major tea producer, and a cup of tea is typically the first thing offered to a guest.





Tehran University of Medical Sciences (TUMS)

Tehran University is the oldest and the highest ranked academic center in Iran. The number and size of TUMS schools have provided the university with numerous advantages, such as

libraries specific for each school, specialized research laboratories, study areas, etc. In 1956, the Faculty of Pharmacy was separated from the Faculty of Medicine and a 5-year PharmD program was established for this major. Since 1986 PhD programs have been started at the faculty of pharmacy, currently there are 10 PhD programs and one specialty are available at the faculty of pharmacy: Drug and Food Control, Medicinal Chemistry, Pharmaceutics, Toxicology and Pharmacology, Pharmacognosy, Pharmaceutical Biomaterials, Pharmaceutical Biotechnology, Pharmaceutical nanotechnology, Radiopharmacy, Pharmacoeconomics and Pharmaceutical Administration and Clinical Pharmacy.

International Night




SEPers' Memories
