5. Campaigns & Projects

World Mental Health Day

On the 10th October Mental Health challenges are in the center of the World attention. According to this years them Focus on suicide prevention, IPSF EuRO created campaign which focussed on sharing crisis lines numbers in European Countries due to suicides being the 2nd leading cause of death among teenegers and young adults. Reduction of suicide rates by 1\3 is one the UN Sustainable Development Goals 2030, to achive that number we have raise people awarness and fight the stimga of mental dissorders.

World Polio Day

On the 24th of October Polio is in the spotlight. The 2019 Day was especially celebrated due to WHO announcement of eradicating worldwide the wild poliovirus type 3 (WPV3). IPSF EuRO Campaign focused on remaining types of polio viruses and emphasized on the importance of Polio prevention by vaccinations.

Movember

November is a month during the year when more attencion is paid for men's health. Mustaches and watchword "Movember" remind and aware people about prostate cancer, testicular cancer and mental health aswell as suicide prevention among men. IPSF EuRO joined this initiative by sharing somesimple steps which can help to decrease the number of incidences and convince men for regular check-ups (not only in November!).

Antibiotic Awareness Week

Antibiotic Awareness Week is a campaign that aims to raise awareness about antibiotic resistance and support better practices among communities and professionals in all healthcare fields. The 2019 campaign took place from 18 to 24 of November and it's main theme was: The future of antibiotics depends on us all. Inspired by this idea we joined the event in order to promote actions contributing to the reduction of spreading Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR). Microbes develop the ability to defeat the drugs designed to kill them due to misuse of antibiotics, poor infection control or Inadequate sanitary conditions. IPSF EuRO took action and by sharing infographics and quizzes informed about threats caused by AMR and changes that should be introduced to put Antibiotic Awareness into practice.

World HIV/AIDS Day

Every year on the 1st December World HIV/AIDS takes place, aiming to encourage people to take the HIV test and support oneswho are infected. The 2019 campaign focus was on Communities making a difference. In line with the topic IPSF EuRO has joined forces with EPSA and created the 5 steps Campaign: 1- Raising Awareness, 2-Prevention, 3- Diagnosis, 4- Treatment (if needed), 5- Empowering. We have launched social media camping to reach as broad a public as possible, accompanied by live activities conducted by Member Organizations.

Anti-counterfeit Drug Campaign


Annually IPSF EuRO joins forces to fight the occurrence of counterfeit medicines on the pharmaceutical market. Falsified medical products may contain the wrong amount of the active ingredient or a wrong active ingredient. They may also include substances that are not mentioned on a label that may be harmful to health. At the beginning of December 2019 we led a campaign in order to inform about the scale of this problem and suggest innovative methods of fighting it. Our members could get involved not only by spreading knowledge gained from the infographics but also by taking part in our photo contest!

World Cancer Day

World Cancer Day is organized each year on the 4th February to increase knowledge about cancers and fighting against them. This vear's theme referred to the I Am and I Will Campaign which underlines that actions taken now impact the future. IPSF EuRO shared infographics about the most common cancers, tests for early detection and some ways of reducing risk factors so everyone could better realize that #IAmAndIWill and our current choices matter.

Digital Health

Use of information and communication technologies (ICT) solutions are constantly and progressively entering the healthcare industry, the aim of IPSF EuRO 2020 Digital Health Campaign was to familiarize our Members with different approaches to the matter in European Countries. The survey on Digital Health was conducted and results were shared on IPSF EuRO social media. Covering in particular e-Pharmacy, students could find out where e-prescriptions can be found and in which countries pharmacists have access to the patient medication list.

























From **16**th to **22**th **of March** IPSF EuRO have run the yearly **Pharmacy Week**. This time we have focused on **Noncommunicable Diseases** (NCDs).

What is a Noncommunicable Disease?

Non communicable diseases are chronic illnesses caused by genetics and external physiological, environmental and behavioural factors. They cannot be passed among people. The main types of NCDs are cardiovascular diseases, cancers, chronic respiratory diseases and diabetes. These diseases account for over 80% of all premature NCD deaths and many of them can be prevented by basic lifestyle changes, which can be initiated in the Pharmacy.

Which is the Pharmacist role?

Pharmacists play an important role in the prevention and treatment of NCDs, especially with conditions such as cardiovascular diseases, chronic respiratory diseases and diabetes.

By making sure that the medication suits the patients and he/she accepts the treatment and holds on to it, we are able to prevent the development of the disease and/or serious exacerbation of the disease leading to strokes, heart and asthma attacks and diabetes

To reach as many students as possible every day we have shared a **challenge** for our Members, to encourage healthy lifestyle, regular blood pressure and sugar checkups.

During Pharmacy Week we have had the pleasure to hold a **webinar** on **Pharmacist's role in beating Noncommunicable diseases** with **Mr. Gonçalo Sousa Pinto**, FIP Lead for Practice Development and Transformation as a speaker. The webinar focused on actions future pharmacists can undertake to help their patients. Moreover, since patients suffering from NCDs are in the risk group for COVID-19, how can we help them and on which aspects we should focus to try to secure their safety.



6. EuRO Inbox

The perception of the pharmacy profession varies immensely around the world. The different focus and the career specializations available also vary vastly according to the national context of the profession. However, there is a vision of pharmacists common to every country: a health care professional that is the medicines expert and responsible for every step of the medicine cycle.

This will prepare us for solid patient counseling and ensure patient safety. Being a good pharmacist means that we have to demand good pharmacy education to ensure we are prepared to embrace this mission!



Pharmacists need to accept and utilize technology to improve outcomes in health. 




ABOUT CORONAVIRUSES

SOCIAL DISTANCING



The virus originated from the city of **Wuhan**, People's Republic of China, patients started experiencing **pneumonia symptoms** from an unknown agent, which turned out to be the **SARS-Cov-2**.

The disease (named **COVID-19** by WHO) reached Europe by the end of **January 2020**, hitting especially Italy and Spain.

By the **beginning of March**, European countries started implementing **preventive measures**, beginning with establishing social distancing, cancelling mass events and switching, where possible, to home offices.


On **11 March 2020** the World Health Organization declared the outbreak as a **pandemic.**

European countries took different measures to prevent the spread of the virus, varying from severe ones like **closing the borders** to less strict ones like **social distancing** and **banning large gatherings**.

SYMPTOMS

The disease ranges from **no symptoms**, to **mild** and **severe** resulting in hospitalisation.

The most common symptoms are:



The disease may also occur with mild symptoms only, including: low-grade fever, cough, malaise, rhinorrhoea, sore throat without any warning signs, such as shortness of breath or difficulty in breathing, increased respiratory secretions (i.e. sputum or haemoptysis), gastrointestinal symptoms such as nausea, vomiting, and/or diarrhoea and without changes in mental status (i.e. confusion, lethargy).

ANEPF FRANCE



ANEPF is working closely with the National Chamber of Pharmacists, a platform was developed in order to connect pharmacy students with pharmacists who need help. Most of the students are required to help in hospitals. Moreover several faculties are producing hydroalcoholic solutions for hospitals and pharmacies. ANEPF is coordinating the cooperation between the students and hospitals/pharmacies, they created a website accessible for students and pharmacists.


AFOP AUSTRIA

APEF PORTUGAL



APEF takes part in the Portuguese Health Student Forum. The national health system asks for help with the preparation of informational materials, which have been shared on social media. Moreover APEF has promoted webinars and other initiatives of their respected partners. The Portuguese Pharmaceutical Society has developed a volunteer platform for pharmacist and pharmacy students (4th and 5th year), with the aim to support and assist hospital pharmacies, as well as support line teams.

CzPSA czech republic



Pharmacy students together with medical students and the Academic Senate created a form for students who are willing to help. Depending on the year of studies, they can choose the Professional option (for students in final years) or the Supportive option (activities such as help with storage and administration at the pharmacy, babysitting staff children, helping nurses, etc.). A Facebook group for students was created where they can connect with pharmacies in need of help. Usually students are able to establish a salary per hour.

PPSA POLAND



PPSA introduced a national campaign #zostańwdomu (translation #stayhome). Members are sharing pictures via Instagram with activities they can do at home during quarantine. Branches of PPSA started online campaigns to educate society and members about basic facts on SARS-CoV-2 and ways of trying to avoid infection. Polish Universities reached out to medical faculties' students and gave them the opportunity to become volunteers to help with the workload of understaffed hospitals.

The European Public Health Association (EUPHA) is an organization for Public Health Associations and Institutes in Europe, based at The Netherlands Institute for Health Services Research (NIVEL), in Utrecht, The Netherlands. It is also important to highlight that EUPHA has a unique network for students and young professionals, including early career researchers and policymakers in Public Health. **EUPHA Next Generation** (EUPHAnxt) is an initiative that aims to involve future generations in a multidisciplinary network of Public Health associations, by sharing information and creating international collaboration opportunities.



For their Annual European Public Health (EPH) Conference, EUPHAnxt has its own EPH Abstract Mentoring Programme, where students and young professionals can request for feedback from experienced individuals, on their submitted abstracts, which are later presented at the conference.

Finally, EUPHAnxt provides an Informal Internship Programme, where candidates access a range of internship opportunities, a few of them reimbursed. Interested individuals have to send their Curriculum Vitae and a Motivation letter, which should include the preferred duration the internship, their motivation for applying as well as some basic information on their background.

EUPHAnxt currently has 2500 active members, between young students and recent graduates, and you can apply to be a part of this initiative and take advantage of all it has to offer
