Hello Sep-ers,

Belgrade is the capital of the southeast European country of Serbia. It's most significant landmark is the Beogradska tvrđjava, an imposing fortress at the confluence of the Danube and the Sava rivers.



I hope my guidance will make your experience in Belgrade much better and also make you feel more welcome! We are very excited to have you.

When you come to Serbia by plane/bus/train some of our students/volunteers will wait for you and show you to your accomodation. Also someone will show you where is your e-practis, and how to get there.

Here are some basics how to make your stay in Serbia more pleasurable.

EXCHANGE OFFICE



National currency in Serbia is **DINAR**. In Serbia you can only pay with dinars. We don't recommend exchanging money at the airport. When you come to Serbia, someone who waits for you will tell you where is the best and cheapest exchange office.



If you want to compare the prices to city that you come from, there is website called **NUMBEO**, if you are not sure how much you want to take with you.

BUSES AND TICKETS



In Belgrade public transportation are mainly **buses, trams** and **trolleybuses**. The best way to get a hold on public transportation routes is the application called **Moovit**.

Ticket is valid for every form of transportation and you can buy it on almost every **kiosk**.



The **prices** of the **ticket**:

Bus Plus card costs *250 dinars (2 euros)* by itself and you have to pay in more money to the card. One ride for 90 minutes is *89 dinar (0,71 euro)*. During this 90 minutes you can change different transportations.

BUSES AND TICKETS



You can also buy card for 1, 3 or 5 days but we don't recommend this type of cards.

This **ticket** are not valid after midnight.

We also have night transportation and they costs *150 dinars (1,20 euros)*.

You can buy ticket in bus and it also costs *150 dinars* (not recommended).





TAXI

If you don't want to wait for the night bus, you can always get taxi.

19803 – Pink taxi

19804 – Naxi taxi

19806 – Gold taxi

Start price is around *200 dinars (1,60 euros)* and we don't recommend using it if it's not necessary.



SIM CARD



In almost every kiosk you can buy different types of SIM cards.

They are **prepaid cards**, so you need to pay in credit and then you can activate different promotions according to your preferences (**Internet, Minutes or Messages**).

There are different operators and the price of the SIM card is around *300 dinars (2,4 euros)*.



ACCOMO- DATION



Hostel (3 e per day for two weeks) if you wish to stay longer then two weeks you have to pay full price that we can manage to reserve for you.

To stay at **host home** (the number of hosts vary every year, and also its simbolic 3 e per day for two weeks).

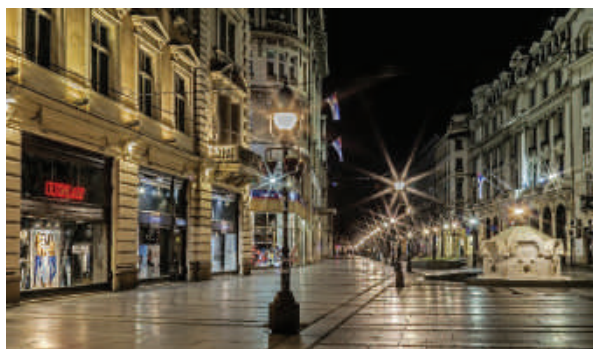

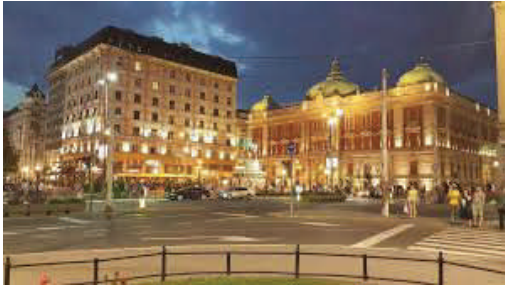

The mainstream clubbing scene consists of venues playing house music, tech house, and turbo-folk (a sub-genre of folk music with dance and pop elements specific to Serbia), but you can also find places specializing in R'n'B, pop, rock, alternative, jazz, or just about any other type of music in existence.

Belgrade is well known for sport, art, history, but **Belgrade nightlife** is one more thing for which Belgrade can be proud of. Attractive destinations, wild parties that last whole night long.



FESTIVALS AND PARTIES

The biggest of all is the **Belgrade Beer Fest** placed in middle of August every year. Free entrance, lots of beer and good music. Also, one of our favorite is the **Jazz Festival**.

In at the end, don't forget Serbian so-called „kafanas“ – bars where you can rest, enjoy but sometimes have fun more then anywhere else with traditional songs that play live.
